We should have 4 Cimels, the SMART trailer and possibly another MPL near Chambersburg, PA (both night and day overpass) operated by Tim.

The tentative sites are included in the attached *.kmz (Google Earth) file, with the exception of the PA site. Some zoomed snapshots as well, with the track line marked in white.

The three Virginia sites are in the vicinity of Dulles and are about 10-15 km apart. All sites are essentially right on top of the Calipso track line.

The protocol will be the same as last time, though the start time may be delayed if it's clear the morning (9-10) almucantar will not be useful due to clouds-- Brent will make this call.
